Missouri Jaycees - January was a rough month for state membership. We saw a loss of 82 members across the state. On the one hand, this is very discouraging, because if we are not growing, we are dying. Overall, our retention rate remained high (54%) BUT we only had 37 new members submitted statewide by only 17 of our 67 chapters.

We need to focus on growing our chapters and that will not happen without new members! Have you ever run a project and said "we just have way too many people to run this project?" Or, when it comes time for elections, do you have too many people running for officer positions? In my experience this is not the case. We need to build our chapter base and activate these members and teach them what we know, so that they are then ready to take over leading the next generation of our chapters. We need to create excitement in everything we do so that newer members want to be involved. So we must continuously recruit new members to survive and thrive!

Our January membership losses are also partly attributable to dues money that was not received in the State Service Center on time or chapters not turning in their renewal information. This deficit can certainly be overcome with each chapter's commitment to submitting their renewal information, new member information and dues payment to the state on time. We also dropped 9 members due in January because the chapters didn't have payment into the State Service Center and/or they didn't communicate renewals to the state team. Even those chapters with only 1 or 2 due contributed to our significant loss. I can't stress to you enough the importance of communicating renewals and new member information to the state team. Every little bit helps and every member counts!!!

So where do we go from here? We commit ourselves to work together and grow this organization. I am personally going to be working on an extension in Chillicothe. I know there are local presidents out there that have an interest in getting a new chapter extension done this year. Have you started working on them? If you are lucky, everything will fall into place

and you will find the right people and the extension will be done within a matter of weeks. However, sometimes things happen that delay the execution of an extension and it ends up taking longer than expected. It is for this reason that you should be actively working on extensions NOW so that you can ensure they are completed this year. Some of you may think extensions sound scary, but really they are very rewarding when you see that you have introduced the Jaycees to a new community and these new Jaycees are coming up with great ideas for themselves and their communities. If you need some help with figuring out where to do an extension, how to start an extension or completing an extension, please contact any member of the state team and we will get you the information or assistance you need. We have people that are willing and able to work to help you get those extensions done!

I have no doubt we are all in store for a great year! "Let's Work Together" to get our chapters to growth!

Hey all! Here we are, month two, and I have to say we have had a great start. I think anyone who attended the Winter State Meeting can tell you that we had a wonderful meeting. Before I go any farther, kudos' to both Joe Jerkins for running it and Jefferson City for hosting a meeting to remember.

I have received tons of calls and emails, of both appreciation and compliments about the training at state meeting. Thanks again to all the trainers who took the time to put together those great trainings for the state to attend. Almost all of our trainers are JCI Local Trainers working on their certifications and I think the extra time they have been putting into becoming Certified Local Trainers (CLT's) is definitely showing in the value they are giving our members!

So you want to become a trainer yourself? We have that opportunity just around the corner for you. We are planning to host the two courses that you need to become certified. At the May State Meeting in Macon we are going to host the JCI Presenter Course. This is the first part of the certification process and is a two day course. We will start the course on Thursday, May 15th at 12 noon and will go thru Friday, May 16th at 6PM. This course teaches the basics of presenting to a group. By taking this course you do not have to move on to become a certified trainer, although this is a pre-requisite for the JCI Trainer course.

If you do want to go all the way and become a certified trainer, the next course to take will be JCI Trainer. We are going to host a JCI Trainer Course at the September State Meeting in North Kansas City. Again, we will start the course on Thursday, Sept. 25th at 12 noon and finish on Friday, Sept. 26th at 6PM. Once you complete these two programs you can start earning your hours towards your certification. To sign up for either of these classes you need to go out to www.jci.cc and register. Once you create a username and password you go under the JCI University Tab and click My University. Once there you will see a list of courses. Find the course on the dates we talked about and register for the course. This part is critical to get you credit for taking the course so we can get you registered as a JCI Trainer. If you have any difficulties in getting this done, contact me and I'll help walk you thru it.

As far as state meeting trainings go, if there is something that you would like to see, contact me and let me know what you want to see. We are constantly looking for new and exciting training ideas we can provide at our trimester conferences.

Last, but certainly not least, I want to thank Ben Clutter for stepping up to become our ON-TO chair for this year. We have National meetings in Memphis and San Diego coming up and I'm sure Ben will have us a good theme for each. I look forward to seeing each of you on the road.

Outstanding Young Farmer & Outstanding Young Missourian Awards

Greetings, Missouri Jaycees! It's a new year and a new position on the state team for me. I have moved from the ON-TO Program Manager to the OYF/OYM Program Manager position. I look forward to a great year for this program as I have a lot of ideas on how your chapter can find your nominees, and expand the program beyond the award itself.

The first idea is a write-up or speak-up. Conduct a write-up or speak-up at your general membership meetings with the topic being something along the lines of: "Name someone you think is an Outstanding Young Missourian and Why." Then judge the write-ups, and the winner is your nominee. Or, if several people name the same person, then maybe that should be your nominee.

The second idea is a scholarship. Conduct an essay contest with local high school seniors with the same topic as your write up, "Name someone you think is an Outstanding Young Missourian and Why." Send the information to the local high school councilors, set a deadline for submissions, judge the essays, award a scholarship to the winner, and submit their "nominee" on to the OYM Program. You could even narrow the field of essays to five then publish the essays in the paper and have the community vote for the winner.

The third idea is simply to ask people. Contact your local Chamber of Commerce or other local organizations to see if they have someone they think should be honored. They may already give an award on a local level that you could work together with them on, then take that winner and submit them for the Missouri Jaycees OYM Award. Police officers, firefighters, EMT's, teachers, clergy, business leaders all make great candidates.

For the Outstanding Young Farmer, you can contact your local 4H / FFA for their input, as they probably have a better feel for nominees than you would. Scholarships will work in the OYF Program as well, just focus your essay contest to the 4H / FFA programs in the local schools.

This program can move far beyond just an award given in January to becoming a project for your chapter. Finding your nominees in any of these ways gives your chapter much needed publicity. Submitting the details of a scholarship to the local media, sending a press release about the winners to the media, will put your chapter in the spotlight. Press releases need to be utilized even if you just pull a nominee out of thin air to submit. And if your nominee is one of the "chosen ones",

another round of press releases is in order to announce that they will be honored in January at a black tie event.

As with every program in the Jaycees, it should always be a recruiting tool. If you publicize your selection process, you may attract members who want to be a part of that process. If you publicize your nominee, then you may get people who join because they think it's about time the nominee got the recognition they deserve and they want to be a part of an organization who would honor them.

Don't forget that submitting a nominee is also worth valuable P.O.C. Points. Submitting a nominee that was chosen from a project would be worth even more points with a completed CPG for that project. Also selecting a nominee as a chapter or region write-up or even a speak-up would award even more P.O.C. points

This program, much like everything we do, really does have unlimited possibilities. It can fall in to any of the areas of opportunity -- it all depends on how you choose your nominee. The limit of the program is up to you. The first step is to download the nomination forms off of the Missouri Jaycees website at http://www.mojc.org/Programs/programs_index.html. Beyond that, come up with a process by which to pick your nominee and make sure to get the paperwork in by July 1, 2008.
